Fearless! Hudson Valley, Inc. is a private, not-for-profit organization serving Orange and Sullivan Counties in New York. As the sole provider of comprehensive services for survivors of domestic violence, teen dating violence, human trafficking, and other forms of abuse in our region, including providing services for survivors of sexual violence in Sullivan County, Fearless! is dedicated to creating a safer more just community for all.

Our team offers free and confidential services designed to meet the unique needs of individuals and families impacted by violence and oppression. These services include crisis intervention, advocacy, counseling, education, and prevention programs. Fearless! also operates a 24/7 hotline and emergency shelter to provide immediate support to those in need.

By confronting inequality, raising awareness, and empowering survivors, Fearless! strives to dismantle systemic oppression and promote equity and accountability. We are committed to ensuring all individuals can experience safe and supportive relationships free from abuse, exploitation, and harm.

Together, with the support of our community, we work to educate, advocate, and transform lives.



FEARLESS! HISTORY

Founded in 1986 as the Orange County Safe Homes Project, Fearless! Hudson Valley began as a small grassroots organization with a hotline and a shelter, dedicated to providing safety and support for survivors of domestic violence. Over the decades, the agency expanded its services and reach, confronting systemic inequality and advocating for justice and safety for all. Guided by a commitment to education, prevention, and survivor-centered advocacy, Fearless! has grown into a vital resource for the community, adapting to meet the evolving needs of those we serve.

Opening of Our First Shelter

The organization opened its first shelter in Orange County, providing a safe haven for victims of domestic violence.

Launching a Toll-Free Hotline

A central toll-free 24/7 hotline was created accompanied by a county-wide billboard campaign to provide confidential support.

Expanding to Combat Human Trafficking

A dedicated Human Trafficking Program was launched to provide advocacy, case management, and resources to survivors.

Began providing advocacy and support for victims and survivors of domestic violence in Sullivan County.

Opening a New Shelter & Expanding Services

Fearless! is committed to empowering young people through education, leadership opportunities, and creative expression. By fostering knowledge and awareness, we aim to prevent violence and promote healthy relationships among youth in communities. Our youth prevention education initiatives provide tools and resources to inspire the next generation to lead with respect, empathy, and equality.

Love Shouldn't Hurt Youth Summit

This interactive event brought students together to explore critical topics such as teen dating violence, self-empowerment, and advocacy. Through workshops and group activities, the summit equipped participants with tools to lead positive change in their schools and communities while fostering a deeper understanding of healthy relationships.

Summer Youth Leadership Academy

This free, week-long program offered high school students in Orange and Sullivan Counties an immersive experience to develop leadership skills, learn about healthy relationships, and understand the impact of violence on individuals and communities.


