A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends,

As we reflect on the past year, 2025 was marked by uncertainty, including persistent threats to our funding, difficult budget reductions, and a broader climate that placed increasing pressure on the communities we serve and intensified attacks on human rights. We have been reminded, again and again, that the narrative of scarcity and division was never designed to serve us. It was designed to keep us apart.

This year underscored that empowerment is not an individual pursuit; it is a collective responsibility. It lives in how we support one another, how we create space for every voice, and how we remain grounded in our shared commitment to equity and justice.

It also reaffirmed something fundamental: our autonomy is not guaranteed. It must be protected, defended, and advanced, together. When the rights of one are challenged, the impact ripples across all of us. And when one voice is silenced, we all lose something essential.

Some forces continue to seek division, to reinforce the idea that there is not enough space, not enough opportunity, not enough power to go around. But this year, more than ever, we rejected that notion. We chose solidarity. We chose to stand side by side. And in doing so, we became stronger.

As we look ahead, we carry both the weight of this past year and the hope it has revealed. We know the road forward will not be easy. But we also know that our collective strength—rooted in trust, courage, and compassion—positions us to meet what comes next. We are cautiously optimistic.

While the landscape remains complex, we see opportunities to rebuild, to deepen our impact, and to stand even more firmly in support of equity and justice. With your continued support, we are confident in our ability to navigate the road ahead and create meaningful, lasting change.

Thank you for standing with us during a difficult year and for believing in a stronger future.

Fearless! Hudson Valley, Inc. is a local nonprofit organization dedicated to supporting individuals and families across Orange and Sullivan Counties with compassion and a survivor-centered approach. We believe safety is a fundamental human right, and that lasting change happens when individuals, communities, and systems work together.

Our mission is to build an informed, just, and accountable society so all people can experience supportive and safe relationships free from abuse, exploitation, and oppression. We do this by education, prevention, advocacy, and providing comprehensive services, including shelter, to victims and survivors of interpersonal violence, human trafficking, sexual violence, and other types of crime victimization.

For the past **39 years**, Fearless! has worked alongside survivors to provide safety, advocacy, and resources during some of the most critical moments of their lives. Our services are designed to meet survivors where they are at, offering immediate crisis response, ongoing support, and pathways toward long-term stability and healing.

PROGRAMS & SERVICES

Comprehensive, Survivor-Centered Support

Fearless! provides free and confidential services that are designed to meet survivors where they are at, offering immediate safety, trauma-informed care, and long-term support.

Advocacy & Victim Support

Across all programs, survivors receive individualized advocacy, including case management, safety planning, crisis counseling, emergency financial assistance, and connection to community resources. Advocates also assist with court accompaniment, enrollment in the New York State Address Confidentiality Program, V.I.N.E. notifications, and Crime Victim Compensation applications, ensuring survivors are supported at every stage of their journey.



Hotline & Webchat Services

The 24/7 hotline operates 365 days a year and provides immediate, confidential support. Translation services are available in more than 200 languages, and webchat support is offered during regular weekday hours. Services are available to survivors, family members, friends, and concerned community members seeking guidance or assistance.



Clinical Services

Fearless! offers trauma-informed therapeutic counseling for adult and child survivors through both individual and group sessions, helping participants process experiences of abuse and rebuild a sense of safety and empowerment. Creative Arts Therapy groups, offered in partnership with Bethel Woods Center for the Arts, provide additional opportunities for healing, connection, and self-expression in a supportive environment.



Prevention, Education & Community Engagement

Through youth and adult prevention education, customized trainings, and community awareness initiatives, Fearless! works to increase awareness of the signs of abuse, how to support survivors, and how to access Fearless! services and resources. Programs such as the Youth Art Contest, Youth Summit, and Summer Youth Leadership Academy empower young people to build healthy relationships and become leaders in their communities.



Sexual Assault Services – Sullivan County

In Sullivan County, Fearless! provides 24-hour hospital accompaniment and advocacy throughout the forensic medical exam process, as well as legal advocacy, campus response, and prevention education to ensure survivors receive compassionate, comprehensive care.



Residential & Housing Services

Fearless! operates confidential emergency shelter locations with 24/7 staff support and capacity to serve up to 37 survivors. Through housing initiatives such as HUD-funded rental assistance, Housing First permanent supportive housing, and Rapid Rehousing programs, survivors receive comprehensive support to secure and maintain stable housing. The Safe Pet Project, in partnership with the Warwick Humane Society, ensures survivors do not have to choose between safety and their pets.



Legal Advocacy

The Legal Advocacy Program supports survivors navigating the family, criminal, and civil justice systems. Advocates assist with filing petitions for Orders of Protection, custody, visitation, and child support, provide Family Court and Grand Jury accompaniment, and collaborate with co-located attorneys to promote survivor-centered outcomes. Specialized advocates are also co-located within the Orange County District Attorney's Office to further strengthen coordinated support for victims throughout the criminal justice process.



Risk Reduction Response

Through the Risk Reduction Response Program (RRRP), Fearless! collaborates with law enforcement and Orange County partners to conduct risk and lethality assessments, provide immediate on-scene hotline connections, and conduct follow-up outreach to high-risk survivors. Specialized advocates are co-located in police departments to strengthen coordinated responses.



Domestic Violence Liaison

Fearless! co-locates advocates within the Department of Social Services to provide direct support to survivors navigating public assistance systems. Advocates conduct waiver assessments, connect individuals to services, and help survivors safely comply with DSS requirements. By working alongside DSS staff in Newburgh and Middletown, the DVL coordinates trauma-informed response and ensures survivors are not re-traumatized while seeking essential support.



Child Welfare Advocacy Program

The Child Welfare Advocacy Program places specialized advocates within Children's Services to support families impacted by domestic violence and trafficking. Through case consultations, joint home visits, and direct service connections, advocates help ensure child welfare responses are survivor-centered and safety-focused. Co-located in Newburgh, Goshen, and Monticello, this program strengthens collaboration between systems while prioritizing the well-being of both caregivers and children.



NEW STRIVE PROGRAM

Strengthening Coordinated Community Response

In 2025, Fearless! Hudson Valley was selected as a partner under New York State’s **Statewide Targeted Reductions in Intimate Partner Violence (STRIVE)** Initiative. Designed to enhance public safety responses to intimate partner abuse and better address the complex needs of victims and survivors, STRIVE focuses on data-driven collaboration, accountability, and survivor-centered practices that aim to better address the complex needs of victims and reduce the escalation of violence.

STRIVE and its funding works to strengthen our existing **Risk Reduction Response Program (RRRP)**, a collaborative effort with Orange County law enforcement and community partners. Through RRRP, Fearless! works closely with select Police Departments and Legal Services of the Hudson Valley to provide coordinated, proactive responses to high-risk cases.

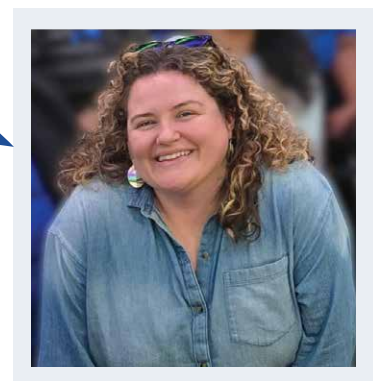

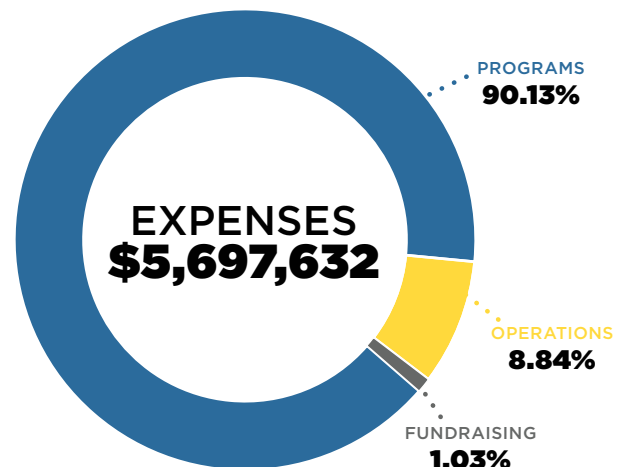
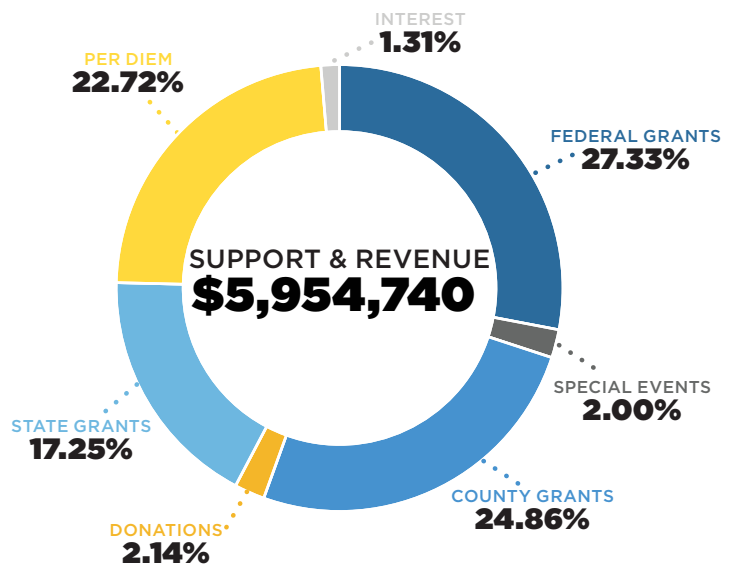

ADVOCATING FOR SURVIVORS

Advocacy does not end with direct services, it extends to the systems, policies, and institutions that shape survivors' lives. In 2025, our Fearless! team, community and state partners worked tirelessly to advance legislation, protect essential funding, and ensure that survivor voices were heard at every level of government. Learn more about recent policies and threats at the state and national level - *because an educated and engaged community is a community that can thrive.*

PROTECTING FEDERAL FUNDING

We joined national partners in urging Congress to restore and protect funding through VOCA, VAWA, RPE, and FVPSA, after 360 federal grants were terminated.



Why it matters:

Federal funding sustains shelters, counseling, prevention, and legal advocacy nationwide.

EXTENDING SHELTER STAYS

Legislation introduced in New York would extend allowable shelter stays, giving survivors additional time to secure safe housing, income, and long-term stability.



Why it matters:

Healing and rebuilding cannot and should not be rushed.

DEFINING COERCED DEBT

New York passed one of the strongest coerced debt laws in the nation, giving survivors a legal path to challenge debt caused by economic abuse.



Why it matters:

Financial control should not trap survivors in unsafe situations.

PRIORITIZING CHILD SAFETY

Kyra's Law seeks to require courts to promptly address credible allegations of child abuse or domestic violence before issuing orders of custody or visitation.

Children's safety must come first.

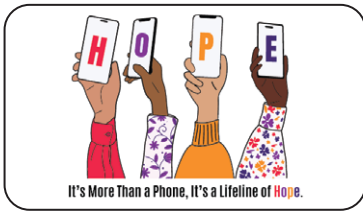

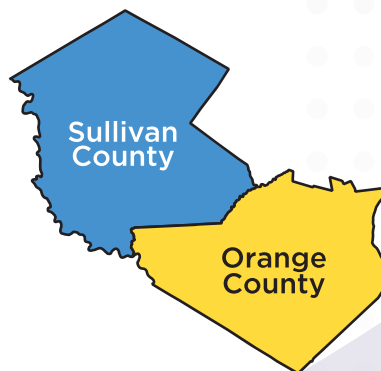
